



### **Membership Growth**




More new-members in 2006: about 140% growth in 2005 & 2006 vs. 2004






### Impact on Resource Allocation



A steady growth in resources allocated has resulted.





### IPv6



Last year, we have been focusing on IPv6 awareness among the community through training and conferences. This has led to more interest in IPv6

### **Policy Development**

Policy	Status
IPv6 Provider Independent (PI) Assignment for End-Sites	Consensus
IPv6 assignment for Critical Infrastructure	Withdrawn
IPv6 Address Allocation and Assignment Policy	To be amended
Change the allocation and assignment period to 12 months	Consensus
Change the IPv6 HD ratio from 0.8 to 0.94	Consensus
IPv6 ULA-Central	No Consensus



### **Cooperation with Other Organisations**

- Building Partnership and collaboration with other organisations:
  - AfNOG (MoU signed during AfriNIC-3)
    - Support joint meetings
    - 10 fellowships to attend joint meetings
    - Support streaming during the meetings
  - AfTLD (MoU signed during AfriNIC-6)
    - AfriNIC will be providing admin support to AfNOG
  - With Other organisations
    - AAU
    - ISOC
- Continue our active participation to the NRO activities through its EC, the ECG and CCG.
- Also working one-to-one with some RIRs
  - E.g.: With APNIC: for ICONS



### **Some Projects**

- Beside our core activity which is Internet Resource management we are working on some other projects of interest for the community:
  - MyAfriNIC: a portal to allow LIRs to easily interact with AfriNIC and manage their resources. Beta testing has been completed.
  - Fee Structure Analysis and Review
  - AIRRS: A tool to evaluate the routing status of resources allocated by AfriNIC and overall statistics on Internet resources in our region
  - Activation of IRR for AfriNIC region
  - Internet Resource Certification (RFC 3779)
  - VOIP between AfriNIC's locations



### **Members**

- First Member Survey in 2007
  - Some Issues identified
    - Website Navigability & Contents
      - Good suggestions from respondents on improvement
    - 62% of respondents suggest new meeting format
      - More regional events
- Mailing Lists
  - We renamed some lists following survey at AfriNIC-5.

- 35% ISP, 22% Education, 16% Govts
- We tried a few new things

  - BoFs on IPv4 Exhaustion, Policy Development Process & ICONS and Anti-Spam
  - Hostmaster Consultation
- Policies
  - 6 Policies presented
    - Three reached consensus
    - · Two withdrawn / to be amended
    - One did not reach consensus
