 - “mirror of the real world”
- What solves the problem?
 - technology, culture, the market

Assured Path Messaging

- **Abandon promiscuous e-mail**
 - **bilateral agreements**
 - **relaying as a business activity**
- **Open rules, open participation**
- **A service, not a product or a protocol**
 - **technology irrelevant**
 - **promiscuous e-mail can persist**
- **Consider threats from the start**
 - **major player goes bad**
